



NOTE:

- The above-mentioned categories are related to the level of benefits and access that a qualified and complying member can be offered according to Her/His level of contribution to the advancement of the profession
- Architecture Firms whose owners / senior representatives / members with a position at the decision-making level or shareholder(s) are qualified professionals and members in good standing, starting from the level of corporate membership are the only ones that can be registered, certified and recognized under the institutes' registration mandate
- This categorization scheme will be used by our partners and other competent institutions (in Public & Private sector or others) in the leverage of professional delivery capacity and the level of experience during various assessments and affiliated qualifications / classifications
- Members are supposed to be sending a detailed notice to the institute constantly, informing about their current practice status in order to keep them in the licensing chart. Classifying them either as an active, recess or retired member and avoid any sort of sanctions, penalties or abduction due to pending dues, professional reliability considerations or breach of the code of practice in different settings.
