

- Recognizing and rewarding best practices and innovations






A BRIEF EVENT DESCRIPTION


This week-long event will be a showcase of the journey of the profession of architecture and allied professionals in Rwanda over the last 27 years, involving local, regional and international practitioners, architectural innovators, researchers and academia, creators of design software, construction material researchers, manufacturers and suppliers as well as the public. We shall be taking stock of the achievements made so far and the contribution that our profession has made to the trends of the country's urban development and Rwanda's economic growth as a whole. The event will also serve to raise the public awareness on the role of the architectural profession and its role in the built environment, as well as addressing the expectations that members of the public have of architects. It will be a time to celebrate and reward architectural excellence as we hope to inspire growth in the profession in different settings.

This event will happen as a continuation of the HABITAT month of October in order to shade light on the role that the institute's members and partnering professionals have played in the country's rebuilding process since 1994.

This is an annual based event and it brings on-board stakeholders who are interested in fast-tracking the milestones of urban development in Rwanda vis-à-vis to the role of architects and allied professionals. This will result in the creation of a national archive platform that will serve to document and effectively inform the public on Rwanda's urban development trends.



PARTICIPATION




The event will be open to all stakeholders involved in the built environment. The event will feature local, regional and international professionals who've designed / worked on buildings or any other type of architectural masterpieces in Rwanda or abroad. We shall feature practitioners who would like to present on innovative architectural project done in their respective countries, to share their expertise on new architectural concepts, design approaches, building costing or and other innovations in different building categories; **residential, healthcare, commercial, public buildings, industrial, landscape, interior design, green building and material innovations.**

Participants to the event will include representatives from local governments, private sectors and civil societies at the national, regional and global level. representatives from sister associations, international organizations, donors, academia, research expert and training institutes.

We shall also host manufacturers and suppliers in the construction industry and they will have a unique opportunity to exhibit, promote and market products during the event, showcasing the performance of their products or services side by side with some featured showcase building(s) in Rwanda. They will be given time to present and introduce avant-garde materials that are emerging in the Rwandan market, and interact with the largest and most reputable community of professionals in the built industry.







Members of the public will be hosted to a live TV and radio show in which they will engage the architectural community in seeking clarity on the role that our members play from the initiation of a construction project up to the execution level on-site, as well as the function and importance of the planning tools like the master plan and others in developing the city skyline.

The institute will join efforts with key partners in carrying out joint site inspections in a bid to promote the significance of professional compliance and ethical practice. A series of events is lined up in the course of the week as indicated in the itinerary below.

Throughout the week, a jury of handpicked practitioners will adjudicate on exhibitions featuring projects executed by seasoned local, regional and international architects, as well as an academic exhibition prepared by the University of Rwanda – School of Architecture. This will culminate in an award ceremony later in the week.

The event will maintain gender parity in terms of women and youth participation, while presenting unprecedented networking opportunities for players in the built industry in Rwanda and the region.
